

SCP Annual Meeting - March 21, 2022 - President's Report on Projects

Thanks to the generosity of so many friends and donors, we were able to complete the following projects in 2021 for the people of Santa Teresa and in the area of Chacocente. Although we were unable to have our usual fundraising events, except for an outdoor ice-cream social, we were able to budget almost \$60,000. This would not be possible without personal donations.

Health - \$25,000\*

-50 Latrines.  
-35 Wells, 3 well covers, 1 well rope pumps, 5 repairs for the wells  
-56 water filters  
Medical supplies for the La Pita Clinic and doctor visits to communities  
Support of health promoters,  
Medicines to MINSA for the people in our communities  
Dental materials

Education - \$13,000\* (plus additional funds from targeted donations)

School supplies and assistance with school lunches for 198 elementary students  
Materials and support for the 10 elementary teachers  
Scholarships for 54 secondary students and 8 postsecondary students

Sustainable Agriculture - \$5,000\*

Support for 244 farmers for sesame seed production and trees for reforestation

Environment - \$8,000\* (plus additional funds from targeted donations)

Visits to the turtle nesting beach for students of the 5 schools  
Turtle nesting protection  
Workshops for environmental education to teachers and students of 7 schools  
Training sessions for the study of migrating birds and bird banding at MOSSI station  
Equipment for park guards
